

Professional Licensure Disclosures

Brevard College does not have any distance education programs that lead to professional licensure. Currently, the only on-campus education programs that lead to professional licensure are Education, Early Childhood Education, and Elementary Education, which prepare students for professional teacher licensure in one of several areas.

In order to meet U.S. Department of Education requirements for disclosure, all higher education institutions are required to disclose to students whether or not their curriculum meets the state educational requirements for licensure or certification in the state in which they plan to practice.

If you are not a resident of North Carolina and you are enrolled in a program leading to professional licensure, Brevard College cannot guarantee that this program will meet state educational requirements for licensure in the state in which you reside.

The College recommends that students consult with their Program Coordinator or the appropriate licensing agency or board in your state prior to beginning your course of study.
